### NEW MURAL 'ALL ABOUT WHS'

Retiring high school principal Annie Wade envisioned the need for a tribute to Wyoming's great school history. Add to that an empty wall and a wonderful dose of Chris Payne art and you have the newest school mural.

Located inside the high school entry, this mural commemorates 128 years of history. It showcases the different school buildings, school buses, clothing and hair styles. You may even recognize some of the students!



The mural starts at the left in very muted tones, almost black and white, and progresses to full color as the time line gets more recent. After the original painting was done, Bill Johnson, Jr. '69, President of Robin Imaging Services, digitized it, enlarged it to entry wall height, print it, put a protective coating on it and installed it.

Jim Barre '72, athletic director, brought his classmate Chris and Principal Wade together. Chris brought Bill Johnson into the mix in a true Wyoming effort.

Annie Wade, the "singing" principal is retiring in June after three fun filled years at the high school. We wish her the best.

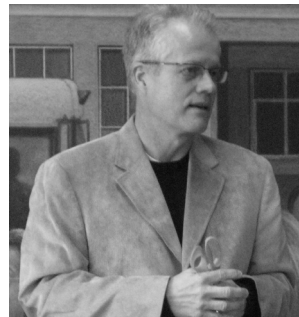

Ferol Betz Guest Lecturer Series: The Betz Series will fund extraordinary educators and presenters whose lectures, creative demonstrations and unique programs will enhance student education and the development of critical thinking skills.

A unique aspect of the MELE is that the Donors will be provided an opportunity to participate in the management and stewardship of the Endowment. Donations to the Endowment are considered to be an investment and the guidelines/principals governing the management of the MELE and the Donor's investments are outlined in the Master Educator Legacy Endowment Prospectus.
