No, we are not proposing a change in the school colors, although depending upon when you graduated, the "memories we hold so dear" were blue and gold or black and white, not our current blue and white. Instead we are talking about what so many others are today – saving resources and expenses by encouraging as many alumni and friends as possible to elect to receive an electronic version of *The ECHO* rather than the traditional snail-mailed hard copy. We currently print and mail more than 6,000 copies and that number will grow each year as another Class graduates from Wyoming High School. If just ten percent (10%) convert, we can cover the cost of one of our \$1,000 scholarships in just the next three issues for those individuals. Imagine how helpful it could be in supporting our scholarship program if half or more than half were to convert in the next two or three years!

You can elect to receive all future issues electronically either by responding to the prompt on our home page, or via our new *Facebook* link. As with other such electronic links, all you will have to do is click on the appropriate "url" link.

RAIN GARDEN DEMONSTRATION PROJECT

AT WHS...Ann Wiggers Verhaeghe '65

The 1,500 square foot rain garden was conceived, designed and created with the cooperation of volunteers from three city commissions, the Wyoming Schools, and a \$30,000 grant from the MSD. The site chosen was the existing detention basin on the east side of Wyoming High School to showcase what individuals and communities can do to "green" storm water management. The area has been landscaped with native perennials, designed to capture and filter storm water run-off from surfaces around buildings, alleviating potential flooding and draining issues. The ground water supply will also be augmented rather than excess water entering the storm sewers.

Those contributing their time and efforts include Debbie Rettig Clark and Jennifer Eismeier from the Environmental Stewardship Commission, Bobbi Strangfeld from Beautify Wyoming, and Todd Wales from the Urban Forestry Board.

This has truly been a collaborative effort to support priorities set forth by Wyoming residents in the City's Master Plan and MSD's region-side efforts to gauge the effectiveness of rain gardens for storm water management. Additionally, the rain garden will serve as an outdoor classroom for students and residents while improving water quality in the Mill Creek Watershed.

'WYOMING' TURNS 150...

The year was 1861. Robert Reily was a wealthy retired merchant living in the house he had built in 1854 in an area with no name. He wrote a letter to some of his neighbors, farmers and businessmen alike, asking them to gather at his home on April 4th to choose a name for this area they lived in. The letter indicated that women were invited and expected to participate! From this gathering came the name "Wyoming". It is an Indian name meaning 'broad valley'. Reily's father, John, and some of the people at the gathering had come to Ohio thru Pennsylvania and crossed over the Wyoming Valley in that state. It was a beautiful place like the one they were living in.

There was a tie between the names Hebron and Wyoming. Reily broke the tie by choosing Wyoming. We are lucky to know so much about the history of our name and how it came to be. The Wyoming Historical Society celebrated this event with a party at the home of Robert Reily whose former home is now 629 Liddle Lane off Reily Road. The First Annual Vintage Golf Classic was held at the Wyoming Golf Club using hickory clubs on one hole. And a community celebration was held at the Civic Center. Mary Ann McIlwain Dodson, AUX '49, was awarded the Col. Robert Reily Award by the Historical Society at the event in the Reily House! The award, given for only the 4th time in 27 years, is awarded for..."significant contributions to the historical quality of our city".

Robert Reily, soon after the naming, joined the Union Army as a Major, was promoted to Colonel, lost a leg at the Battle of Chancellorsville and as a result died May 3, 1863.
